Dear Parishioners,

On that first Christmas, the angels praised God, saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and peace on earth to men of good will." Jesus did not come as a king, general, or billionaire. St. Paul taught, "Because you are God's chosen ones, holy and beloved, clothe yourselves with heartfelt mercy, with kindness, humility, meekness, and patience. Bear with one another; forgive whatever grievances you have against one another. Forgive as the Lord has forgiven you. Over all these virtues put on love, which binds the rest together and makes them perfect. Christ's peace must reign in your hearts, since as members of the one body you have been called that peace" (Colossians 3:12-15). This Christmas, Christ offers to each of us His security and peace, when we accept Him and offer our love to Him, we find the greatest gift of all, now and forever.

As your pastor, I thank you for your dedication, sacrifices, and hard work that enable this parish to be a sign of the Lord's presence in this world and His instrument of peace. In particular, I thank those who serve in the various ministries and organizations. On behalf of Father McShurley and Father Pinizzotto, and all of the Staff at St. Agnes, I wish each of you a blessed and joyous Christmas and New Year! Please be assured of my prayers for your intentions and a remembrance at Holy Mass. May the peace, joy, and love of the Holy Family be present in your lives each day of the New Year.
