Treasures from Our Tradition

Using beads for prayer and meditation is an ancient custom, found in many cultures and religions. The Christian rosary dates from the twelfth century, when it provided a way for ordinary Christians to learn about the lives of Jesus and Mary.

Alan de la Roche, a fifteenth-century Dominican, preferred "Psalter of Our Lady" to "rosary." This fitting name recalls an explanation of the devotion's origin. Unable to read the one hundred fifty psalms that formed the Church's "official" daily prayer, medieval Christians substituted first one hundred fifty Pater Nosters, and later one hundred fifty Ave Marias. By meditating on the various mysteries of the rosary while repeating these simple prayers, the faithful could immerse themselves in the whole mystery of the Incarnation and the Resurrection.

The dedication of October to the Blessed Virgin Mary is an appropriate reminder of this venerable form of prayer. Faithful Christians everywhere continue to meditate on the mysteries of the rosary, praying in groups or alone.

Safe Haven Baby Boxes

BABY BOX FUNDRAISER

WHAT ARE SAFE HAVEN LAWS?

Did you know that Virginia has great Safe Haven Laws that allow parents or guardians to safely surrender infants within the first 30 days of life? For example, if a mom realizes that she is not ready to parent, she can hand her unharmed newborn to a first responder or emergency room staffer with no questions asked.

WHAT IS A BABY BOX?

Another option is for that mom to anonymously surrender her child by placing the infant in an alarmed, climate-controlled safety device known as a Safe Haven Baby Box. The baby box, typically installed in a fire station, ensures that the child is in the care of trained professionals within minutes, while the mom can receive resource information for her own self-care, which is provided in the baby box.

HOW CAN I HELP BRING A BABY BOX TO NORTHERN VIRGINIA?

Safe Haven Baby Boxes have been saving lives across America, but currently there are none in our area. A broad coalition of Virginians are working to raise funds for a Safe Haven Baby Box to be installed at a fire station in our community. Your generous donation will allow for the construction, installation, promotion, and maintenance of baby boxes to help moms and babies in need.

In 1573, Pope Gregory XIII changed the title of this feast day to "Feast of the Holy Rosary." In 1969, Pope Paul VI changed the name of the feast to "Our Lady of the Rosary."

Prayer to Our Lady now focuses more on peace than on military victory.
