Dear Parishioners,

As we draw closer to our Christmas, please know that I and my brother priests are praying for you and all of your family members. During Advent, we pray, "*O come, O come, Immanuel*," that is "*Come, God, be with us.*" He did come. Our Savior, true God, entered this world becoming also true Man, and was born that first Christmas. He came to perfectly reveal God's love and truth, so that we who believe could live in justice and find peace now, and one day have eternal peace in Heaven. The words of Jesus should resound in our hearts, "*God so loved the world that He gave us His only begotten Son, not to condemn the world but to give everlasting life to those who believe.*" (John 3:16)

Let us open our hearts and receive the beautiful gift of Jesus once again this Christmas. As we continue our Advent preparation, we must pause and ask ourselves again, "How can I better open my heart to receive this gift—Jesus—and cherish Him with all my love? What gift can I give in return? Simply, our Lord offers to each of us His infinite love, and each of us must offer our love in return.

Take time to pause and do a charitable giving inventory of time and talent: Am I serving my parish in some way by participating in a liturgical ministry (usher, lector, server, or choir member) or a parish organization (Knights of Columbus, Bethany Ministry, Young Adults, Youth Group, Arts and Crafts Guild, Boy Scouts, or Gardening Angels)? Take time to pause and do a charitable giving inventory of treasure: With all that the Lord has given to me, do I offer a fair "first fruits" sacrificial tithe?

On behalf of Fr. Haissig, Fr. Oetjen, Fr. Kist, I wish you each a blessed Christmas. May the Lord dwell in your hearts and homes this Christmas.





Treasures from Our Tradition


In ancient pagan Rome, these days in mid-December were a time for general slacking off at work and far too much rejoicing. The period of leisure after the harvest and a whole cluster of pagan festivals were a force for the church to reckon with. The Saturnalia, breaking out on December 17th, was a time of high living and loose morals. Christians were advised by their bishops to drop out of the mayhem and do some serious fasting. A famous church council at Saragossa in Spain made a season of fasting mandatory from December 17th to December 23rd, exactly coinciding with the Saturnalia. The bishops at that time were perhaps less concerned with preparing for Christmas than with resisting the kind of loose living going on. Modern times have restored a bit of the Saturnalia spirit to our culture, so that a general period of partying with a vague connection to religion is now upon us. How does a Christian keep balance? The practice of charity by remembering the poor in our gift-giving, of hospitality in finding a place at our holiday tables for the poor and lonely, and of daily prayer in the home and at church are great helps. Although Advent is not a penitential season like Lent, it is a time for making room in our lives for what matters most. - Rev. James Field
