

Lenten Observance

All Catholics are obliged to fast and abstain from meat on Good Friday. Also, Friday of Lent is a day of abstinence. Fasting is obligatory from age 18 until 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. Abstinence from meat is obligatory from age 14 onwards.

Sacrament of Penance are on Wednesdays during Holy Hour 7:30 p.m. to 8:15 p.m.; Saturdays 8:00 a.m. to 9:00 a.m. and 3:00 to 4:00 p.m.; and by appointment.






