Welcome Father Folmar!

Fr. Michael Folmar (Fr. Folmar) was ordained for our Diocese June 9, 2018 on the memorial of the Immaculate Heart of Mary, a very significant day for him. For, it was Our Lady and her Immaculate Heart that have guided him throughout his life. Father's first parish assignment was at St. Mary of the Immaculate Conception in Fredericksburg and he served next at St. Michael's where he has been for the past three years.

Fr. Folmar was born in Pittsburgh (Go Steelers! – you know yinz like them!), where both sides of his family are from and has lived in various places due to his father's job, but mainly lived in our amazing Diocese in Northern Virginia. Therefore, he transferred back here to our home Diocese to Mount Saint Mary's in Emmitsburg, Maryland. Fr. Folmar is very grateful to the Franciscans for all the ways that God formed him there, which was in ways that he never would have been formed if he had not gone there first. Fr. Folmar is so excited to serve here at St. Agnes where his two loves, Our Eucharistic King and Our Lady, are held in high esteem.

Fr. Ricky Malebranche grew up in Dale City, Virginia, the youngest of three children in a faith-filled family. He attended Holy Family Church, where he received his sacraments of initiation, and St. Thomas Aquinas Regional School from kindergarten through eighth grade. He remained active in youth ministry throughout middle and high school.

After earning a degree from George Mason University, he worked there as an admissions counselor while completing an M.A. in Human Services Counseling. During that time, he also began serving as the coordinator of youth ministry at St. Philip Church in Falls Church—a role he continued during the first year of his five-year tenure as a school counselor at Saint John Paul the Great Catholic High School, while earning an M.Ed. in School Counseling. He later moved to the Haymarket area and began attending St. Katharine Drexel Mission.

While serving as the stakeholder for a group from St. Katharine's during the Diocesan WorkCamp of 2018, he experienced an unmistakable call to the priesthood during an evening of Eucharistic Adoration.

Fr. Ricky entered seminary in 2019 and was ordained a priest in 2025. He has a deep love for Our Lady, the rosary, and the sacrament of confession.

He is excited to begin his priestly ministry as Parochial Vicar at St. Agnes Church.

SAINT OF THE WEEK Saint Maria Goretti (1890-1902) | July 6th

Does anything match a mother's pride in her children? First Communions, confirmations, graduations, weddings: how these delight a mother's heart! Imagine, then, Assunta Goretti, the only mother ever to attend her child's canonization! In poverty-stricken rural Italy, widowed Assunta tended fields for the Serenelli family, whose eighteen-year old son Alessandro propositioned her barely twelve-year old Maria; then, when she resisted, crying, "It is a sin! God forbids it!" he stabbed her fourteen times. As she lay dying, Maria assured the attending priest, "Yes, I forgive Alessandro! I want him to be in Paradise with me someday." Imprisoned, unrepentant, Alessandro changed after dreaming that a radiant Maria had offered him fourteen lilies. "I've kept my promise," she smiled. "You'll be here with me someday." Upon release, he rushed to beg Assunta's forgiveness. "Jesus has forgiven you," she replied, "my Maria too. How can I refuse?" Next morning, mother and murderer walked arm in arm to church and knelt side by side for Communion.




