Communion: Uniting ourselves with Jesus and other baptized Christians in the Church, which has its source and summit in the Eucharist.



Dear St. Agnes RE Parents,

Welcome to the 2025-2026 Religious Education program at Saint Agnes Catholic Church.

The Saint Agnes Faith Formation Office is dedicated to support and equip you as the primary educators of your children and reinforce the faith formation they receive at home. Last year, we introduced a monthly Family Faith Formation (FFF) program that invited all members of the family for pizza dinner, a brief catechesis with Monsignor Saunders and fun discussions and activities. These highly popular FFF sessions will feature a series of topics aimed at empowering families to, together, deepen their relationship with God, live and learn their faith, share their faith stories, and strengthen their relationships with each other.

On all other weeks, students will continue their faith formation in class using Word of Life for Grades 1-7. This textbook and online series was created by the Augustine Institute (creators of Formed.org) and Ignatius Press (publishers of Faith & Life). Our 8th Grade students delve more deeply into the Faith through the Chosen Confirmation series by Ascension Press. A Flipped Classroom model is used where students preview the chapters, with their parents, in preparation for their in-person class. Classes are scheduled on Tuesday evenings from 6:15PM-7:30PM. Non-parishioners will need permission from their pastor to receive Religious Education in St. Agnes.

At your child's Baptism, you asked the Church for eternal life for your child. In doing so you accepted your duty to bring them up in the Faith, to keep God's commandments, and witness God's love to your children and neighbors. We commend your commitment to keep that promise by enrolling them in Religious Education. Your example and witness to your own love for Christ by living a faithful sacramental life, praying as a family, attending to your own personal faith formation and making God the first priority in your life is immeasurable.

This priority of "God First" is the reason why participation every year in Religious Education is essential. Our Sacramental preparation program is typically a two year preparation to ensure the children and their family are spiritually prepared and committed to First Penance, First Holy Communion and Confirmation. **Please note that an additional registration is required for sacramental year students, including students currently studying in a Catholic school.**

For students who were unable to receive the sacraments at the usual time or have not previously or consistently received religious instruction, we offer a Special Sacraments class on Sunday mornings to act as introductory or "bridge" class to regular Religious Education.

This RE Parent-Student Handbook explains our program, philosophy, and expectations. We pray that as we accompany you and your child in this spiritual journey, we may all be blessed with the grace of Jesus Christ, ever Present in our midst and especially Present in the Most Holy Eucharist.

PROGRAM DETAILS

St. Agnes Religious Education

THE ROLE OF PARENTS

Parents have the primary responsibility of raising and training their children in the Faith, as they had promised at their child's Baptism. Through their lived example of faithful participation in the sacramental life of the Church, the practice of virtues and prayers, and their own lifelong discipleship, parents exercise the greatest influence on the faith of their children.

St. Agnes Religious Education strives to support parents through a formal, structured and organized program of catechesis and formation for both students and parents.

In addition to helping their children prepare for RE classes, *parents are expected to participate in the monthly Family Faith Formation (FFF) class offered on the first RE session of each month* (except in December and May). These sessions offer families a chance to grow together in the Faith and meet other families to create a community of encouragement and support. A pizza dinner, engaging discussions and fun activities make this a monthly family event to look forward to.

For Special Sacraments students, a parent or a grandparent is required to attend the class with the student. They must be fully engaged in class and committed to reinforce lessons at home.

THE FLIPPED CLASSROOM MODEL

The Flipped Classroom model allows children to learn at home (with their parents' supervision) through online lessons and/or textbook activities to help them prepare for class. This frees up time in the classroom for the catechist to provide more in-depth instruction, creative exploration and opportunities for meaningful activities and liturgical celebrations.

ADORATION, DEVOTIONS & CONFESSIONS

St. Agnes students will be given several opportunities to grow in prayer and encounter Christ through participation in Holy Hour, Confessions and other seasonal devotions. Families are encouraged to take part in these activities, as well.

PARISH PARTICIPATION

Several organizations in St. Agnes promote a sense of belonging and community through the joyful exercise of their own charisms. Through intentional collaborations with these organizations, parishioners will find more areas for support, encouragement, service and friendship.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION POLICIES

ATTENDANCE & BEHAVIOR

Regular and consistent attendance in RE classes is essential in helping students master knowledge of the faith. Classes run for one hour and 15 minutes: Tuesdays, 6:15 PM-7:30 PM. **Students are allowed no more than 4 absences (excused or unexcused).** Please inform your catechist AND the Director of Faith Formation (DFF) if your child will be absent.

Students are expected to be punctual and prepared for class. Class preparation is primarily done through completion of lessons assigned in Word of Life (Gr. K-7) and Chosen (Gr. 8).

Tardiness can be a serious disruption to the class. With only one class per week, we appreciate your cooperation in getting your child/children to class ON TIME each week.

Students are expected to be respectful towards their teacher, their classmates and their environment. If a student consistently causes disruption in the class, a parent may be asked to sit in with their child for the duration of RE classes.

EARLY DISMISSALS & INCLEMENT WEATHER

If a child must leave class early, a parent is required to inform the Director of Faith Formation, Lisa Orosa, at drop off or via email so that the child may be brought to the Front Office for pick-up. Students will only be released to those persons listed as authorized to pick up. In case of inclement weather, St. Agnes follows Arlington Public Schools for class cancellations. Please check WTOP for announcements.

DRESS CODE & USE OF ELECTRONIC DEVICES

Students should dress comfortably according to the weather, but modesty in dress should always be maintained. Articles of clothing with inappropriate images or sayings (drugs, alcohol, profanity, weapons) are not permitted. Short shorts, ripped shorts, leggings, bare midriffs, (girls) or low hanging pants (boys) are not permitted. Pajamas are unacceptable. Hats must be removed before entering the building.

Students and parents who bring cell phones to class must keep these devices turned off and out of sight. Smart watches and similar devices must also be turned off and out of sight. At no time during class are students permitted to use these devices, unless the catechist requires it for a specific activity (ex. Kahoot). Otherwise, all devices must be turned off. Failure to comply may result in the confiscation of these devices with the parents having to pick it up from the RE Office.

EXAMS AND ASSESSMENTS

In compliance with the Arlington Diocesan Standards of Learning, students will be given assessments to measure learning (not their personal faith) and to aid in planning for lessons. Students are expected to score 70% or higher in their online or written assessments with Word of Life, for both chapter tests and unit tests. Students may retake these tests as necessary. In addition, a midterm and final exam is given to assess a student's knowledge of the subject and prayers. Students must receive a grade of 70% or higher to be promoted to the next grade level.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION POLICIES

CLASSROOM POLICIES

- Students are reminded that all property and possessions found in the classroom are to be left untouched. Desks are not to be moved from their allocated position.
- No food or drink, including chewing gum is allowed in the classrooms because of food allergies.
- Items that could cause injury to a student or others (including dangerous toys) are not permitted in the building.
- Every student has the right and privilege to learn in a classroom where students are well behaved. Similarly, every catechist has the right to teach in such an environment. In the event a student does not exhibit proper behavior, the catechist will call upon the Director of Faith Formation (DFF) to remove the child from the classroom. If the child is unable to refrain from the improper behavior, the DFF will enlist the support of the parents to rectify the situation.
- Students and catechists must comply with the prevailing Center for Disease Control & Prevention and Diocesan guidelines to keep our students and staff healthy and safe.

SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Students preparing for First Holy Communion and Confirmation are required to have two years of in-person instruction and preparation. Several requirements specific to sacramental preparation are detailed in a separate sacramental packet.

The best preparation to receive these sacraments is through faithful attendance of Sunday Mass and holy days of obligation in person. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Catholic Faith because it is Christ Himself, fully Present in the Eucharist whom we receive and nourishes us. The graces received at Mass are immeasurable and necessary in the life of a disciple. The goal of sacramental preparation is to help one live a fully sacramental life. If you are struggling to make Sunday Mass the foundation and priority in your family's life, please contact our Religious Education Office to discuss how we can help you.

In addition, spiritual retreats, service opportunities and Confirmation Sundays are planned to help students reflect more deeply into the great gift of the sacraments they are to receive and to learn how to fully live out their faith amidst the challenges of the world today, and grow in their relationship with Our Lord Jesus Christ.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT TRAINING

All program employees, staff and volunteers who have direct contact with children are subject to a background check, completion of a VIRTUS seminar and compliance with the Diocesan Office of Protection of Children & Young People (OPCYP).

St. Agnes Religious Education program participates in and adheres to the Safe Environment Training Program – Circle of Grace. This program provide age appropriate lessons on the topic of personal safety. Catechists in the program are responsible for administering these lessons, the curriculum for which is provided by the Arlington Diocese.

THE CURRICULUM & STANDARDS OF LEARNING

TEXTBOOKS & OTHER RESOURCES

Kindergarten through 7th Grade will use the **Word of Life series by Augustine Institute and Ignatius Press**. Students will receive both a textbook and access to online text and activities. Students are expected to complete their lessons and receive an assessment grade of 70% or more.

All students must complete lessons prior to attending class in order to receive the benefit of the Flipped Classroom model.

8th grade will use **Chosen: Your Journey towards Confirmation by Ignatius Press**. Students are expected to fully engage in the discussions to get the most out of the class. Once a month, students and a parent are expected to participate in Confirmation Sundays, where they participate in discussion-based activities with young adult leaders to help them learn how to live the Faith in today's world. For these sessions, we will use **Envision: Theology of the Body for Middle School by Ascension Press.** In addition, 8th graders are expected to review key concepts learned in previous years in order to prepare adequately for a comprehensive Confirmation exam in the Spring. The Confirmation Exam and interview will help determine the readiness and willingness of the candidate to live out the Faith fully and "to give an explanation to anyone who asks you for a reason for your hope." (1Peter 3:15)
