Dear First Holy Communion Parents

This preparation time for First Penance and First Eucharist marks an important step in your child's formation in the Catholic faith. What a wonderful privilege it is for you to talk to your son or daughter about your relationship with Jesus; to teach them how much God loves them and waits for them in the Sacrament of Penance; and how Jesus, the Bread of Life, sustains us for the Christian journey!

Passing on the Church's faith in the love of God and the values taught to us by Jesus Christ, is the most important thing you can do as a parent. As children grow and learn, they make mistakes. It is all part of learning. Teaching your child forgiveness and humbly asking for forgiveness are important lessons in shaping them to become the person that God has created them to be. The Sacrament of Penance is an encounter with the merciful love of Christ that lets children know that there is nothing that they can ever do that will make God love them less. He waits for them with great love in the Confessional to offer His mercy and healing.

As parents, we nourish our children with good food to help them grow strong and healthy. Catholics truly believe Jesus' words in John 6:53-55: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." When we receive the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Himself - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity - in both the literal and spiritual sense of the word. Jesus, who takes the form of bread and wine, comes to us to nourish us, strengthen us, and unite with us so that we may be one with Him and the Father and the Holy Spirit, and be empowered to live out our mission. The Holy Eucharist truly is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324)

This is the gift your child receives at First Communion. At every Mass, Jesus becomes entirely and absolutely present among us. Jesus Christ is God's total and absolute Love made flesh. As human beings we can't love like this. Yet, in the Eucharist, we receive Christ's Body and Blood so that we can experience this kind of infinite love. This infinite love is made manifest in the Eucharist. As we partake of the Eucharist, Christ intimately unites Himself to us, so we may participate in the Trinitarian Love of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit and share this Love with others.

The home is the primary place where faith is cultivated. Parents are their child's primary example of how to live as a Christian and you remain integral to your child's spiritual formation throughout life. By living a fully sacramental life, availing of the Sacrament of Penance regularly and the Holy Eucharist every Sunday, you model the trust, love and faith you desire for your children in their relationship with God. As you attend to your own personal faith formation and holiness, you model the true meaning of discipleship. As expressed in the words of every baptismal liturgy, the handing on of the faith is primarily the responsibility of parents, and you are described as the first and best teachers of your children in the ways of faith. You are not alone in this role. We, at St. Agnes, are ready to guide, support and encourage you as you lead your family to become intentional disciples of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

YEAR TWO REQUIREMENTS

TAKE HOME WORKBOOKS

Students must complete two workbooks: Penance & 1st Communion. These workbooks are sent home to allow parents to share in the preparation of their children and grow together in their love for the Eucharist.

DUE DATES: January 7, 2025 (Penance WB) and April 1, 2025 (Communion WB).

MASS JOURNALS & BINGO

Attending Sunday Mass is the most important preparation to receiving First Communion.

Students are asked to thoughtfully complete the weekly Mass Journal sheets. In addition, optional Bingo cards will be given to students each month. Submit the completed Mass Journal & Bingo cards for a special prize at the end of the month.

PARENT INVOLVEMENT & FAMILY FAITH FORMATION

This special time of preparing children to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist becomes more meaningful and memorable with the parents' active involvement in their child's preparation. With the Flipped classroom approach, students are able to prepare for their Religious Education classes beforehand using Word of Life, with the help and support of the parents. This allows the catechist to devote more time to delve deeply into the Faith, and for more creative learning and liturgical celebrations in the classroom.

STUDENT & PARENT RETREATS

Parents are required to attend a Parents Retreat for 1st Penance on Feb. 22, 2025 to help their students prepare for this sacrament of mercy. Students will go to their First Penance retreat on March 22, 2025. A mandatory First Communion retreat on for both students and parents will be held on May 3, 2025.

Parents are expected to be actively involved with the formation of their children by helping them with online lessons and workbooks, praying together as a family, faithfully attending Mass and availing of the Sacrament of Penance. In addition, parents are expected to participate in the monthly Family Faith Formation (FFF) sessions that will take place on the first RE session of each month. Children and catechists will join the parents for these monthly sessions as they grow together and build relationships with other families.

FIRST PENANCE & FIRST COMMUNION

Students will receive their First Penance on March 22nd, immediately after the First Penance Retreat. Students are asked to wear their Sunday's best.

Families have two options to schedule their child's First Communion: May 10th at the 5PM Anticipated Sunday Mass or on May 11th at the 11AM Sunday Mass. Appropriate First Communion attire is required.

FIRST COMMUNION ATTIRE

GIRLS should wear white dresses with shoulders and back covered (sleeveless dresses need to be covered, e.g. with a sweater; cap sleeves are okay) as well as white shoes, white socks or tights, and white veil. Dresses should be kneelength or longer.

BOYS should wear a white shirt, a tie, dress pants, dress shoes, and a jacket (conservative colors).

Gloves are not allowed, and the children may not carry anything in their hands at Mass (i.e. no purses, books, rosaries, etc.).

Parents are the best and primary models of faith, reverence and discipleship for children.
