Dear First Holy Communion Parents

This preparation time for First Penance and First Eucharist marks an important step in your child's formation in the Catholic faith. What a wonderful privilege it is for you to talk to your son or daughter about your relationship with Jesus; to teach them how much God loves them and waits for them in the Sacrament of Penance; and how Jesus, the Bread of Life, sustains us for the Christian journey!

Passing on the Church's faith in the love of God and the values taught to us by Jesus Christ,\ are among the most important things you can do as a parent. As children grow and learn, they make mistakes. It is all part of learning. Teaching your child forgiveness and humbly asking for forgiveness are important lessons in shaping them to become the person that God has created them to be. The Sacrament of Penance is an encounter with the merciful love of Christ that lets children know that there is nothing that they can ever do that will make God love them less. He waits for them with great love in the Confessional to offer His mercy and healing.

As parents, we nourish our children with good food to help them grow strong and healthy. As Catholics, we truly believe Jesus' words in John 6:53-55: "Amen, amen, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you do not have life within you. Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life, and I will raise him on the last day. For my flesh is true food, and my blood is true drink." When we receive the Eucharist, we receive Jesus Himself - Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity - in both the literal and spiritual sense of the word. Jesus, who takes the form of bread and wine, comes to us to nourish us, strengthen us, and unite with us so that we may be one with Him and the Father and the Holy Spirit, and be empowered to live out our mission. The Holy Eucharist truly is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324)

This is the gift your child receives at First Communion. At every Mass, Jesus becomes entirely and absolutely present among us. Jesus Christ is God's total and absolute Love made flesh. As human beings we can't love like this. Yet, in the Eucharist, we receive Christ's Body and Blood so that we can experience this kind of infinite love. The love that we desire more than anything at all is given to us, to become one with us through eating and drinking, to change us forever, into this very same gift of love for the world.

The home is the primary place where faith is cultivated. Parents are their child's primary example of how to live as a Christian and you remain integral to your child's spiritual formation throughout life. By living a fully sacramental life, availing of the Sacrament of Penance regularly and the Eucharist every Sunday, you model the trust, love and faith you desire for your children in their relationship with God. As expressed in the words of every baptismal liturgy, the handing on of the faith is primarily the responsibility of parents, and you are described as the first and best teachers of your children in the ways of faith. You are not alone in this role. We, at St. Agnes, are ready to guide, support and encourage you as you lead your family to become intentional disciples of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

TAKE HOME WORKBOOKS

Students must complete two workbooks:
Penance & 1st Communion. These workbooks
are sent home to encourage parents to be
more involved in their child's faith formation
& grow together in the Faith.

DUE DATES: 2/3/23 (Penance WB) & 4/21/23
(Communion WB).

HOLY CARDS

Attending Sunday Mass is the most important preparation to receiving First Communion.

Students are required to collect holy cards from the presiding priest at the end of each Mass or turning in bulletins in exchange for a holy card, if they did not attend at St. Agnes.

PARENT RETREATS & INVOLVEMENT

This special time of preparing children to receive Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist becomes more meaningful and memorable with the parents' active involvement in their child's preparation. With the Flipped classroom approach, students are able to prepare for their Religious Education classes beforehand through My Catholic Faith Delivered, and the catechist devotes more time in delving deeply into the Faith, allowing for more creative learning and liturgical celebrations in the classroom. Parents are expected to be more actively

involved with the formation of their children by working through online lessons and workbooks with their children.

In addition, mandatory attendance in First Penance retreat for Parents allow parents to reflect on their experience with the Sacraments so as to better prepare their children to receive Penance and the Eucharist. A parent-student retreat for First Communion allows parents to share their faith with their children while participating in meaningful shared experiences. FIRST PENANCE

Students are required to attend a mandatory First Penance retreat which culminates in the reception of their First Penance. This retreat shall take place one month after the mini Penance retreat for parents.

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION

Students must attend a First
Communion retreat and practice with at least one parent in preparation for their special day of receiving Jesus in the Most Holy Eucharist. This shall take place 1 day prior to First Holy
Communion
