Dear parents of children in Religious Education,

I want to welcome you to a new year of our Religious Education program. We always remember that you, as parents, are the primary teachers of your children in everything, especially the faith. Last year was a particularly hard year for you as parents but thank God we all persevered. We wish to thank you in advance for caring for your children enough to educate them in the Faith. Our CCD program is designed to supplement, not replace, the faith formation your children receive at home. Our goal is to provide those who are already baptized a continuous education of the Catholic faith. We are blessed to have outstanding parents and catechists who make this important task of bringing children closer to Christ and His Church possible.

I would like to encourage you to work with your children, help them with their homework in the My Catholic Faith Delivered program and review the material assigned each week. In particular, it is very important to pray regularly with your children, so that they will not only learn their prayers, but that prayer will also become an important part of their daily life and help you all in your relationship with our Lord.

Also, it is of course, vitally important that you attend Mass with your children every Sunday and on Holy Days of Obligation (or online if health conditions require). The Mass is the summit of our Faith and therefore should become the center of our lives. By praying and attending Mass with your children, you help foster their relationship with God. Prayer is the primary means of obtaining grace for ourselves and for those we teach.

This Parent-Student Handbook explains our program, philosophy, and expectations.

Mission:

The mission of our Religious Education Program at St. Agnes Catholic Church is to look upon each child as created in the image and likeness of God and as a reflection of His goodness. Our program exists to evangelize the students and their parents in the gospel of Jesus Christ in order to deepen their awareness and understanding of God's loving presence in their lives, to strengthen their relationship with God as Father, Son and Holy Spirit, and to provide them with opportunities to live and give witness to their Catholic faith.

The core elements listed below form the foundation and strength of the St. Agnes Religious Education Program. Through the application of these we seek to cultivate the hearts, minds and souls of our students to become the person God created and called them to be.

Parents' role:

Parents are a child's first teacher. Love of God, prayer and the Catholic Faith are taught to a child in their home and these lessons are reinforced by their parent's example. The St. Agnes CCD program and the Faith Formation office strive to work alongside parents to help them educate their children with a formal, structured and planned program of catechesis and formation. This program should complement, not replace, the Catholic lessons children should receive in the home.

All Christian education finds its source within the sacramental life of the Church. Therefore, it is of the utmost importance that children are given the opportunity to go to Confession and attend weekly Sunday Mass. Knowledge of the Catholic Faith that is not upheld by the practice of the sacramental life is empty knowledge. CCD classes complement the sacraments and Mass, but do not replace them. Please ensure that your children participate in the life of the Church.

Attendance

Attendance:

Regular and consistent attendance in the CCD program is essential in helping students master knowledge of their faith. Poor attendance can negatively impact a student's ability to master this knowledge. Parents set a good example by **making class a priority**. Please inform the Catechist or the DFF if your child/children will be absent.

Students are expected to be punctual and prepared for class. Students should arrive on time and have completed any homework assigned.

Student's Role: Students should be respectful to their teacher and fellow students and conduct themselves in a manner appropriate to a classroom environment.

Tardiness:

Tardiness can be a serious disruption to the class. We only have one and a quarter hour per week, so we appreciate your cooperation in getting your child/children to class ON TIME each week.

Early withdrawal from class: If a child must leave class early, a parent is required to inform the DFF Lisa Orosa, at drop off, so that the child can be brought from the classroom to the front office/door for pickup.

Class Cancellations:

Please note that Religious Education classes follow the Arlington County school closings for Inclement Weather.

In the event of inclement weather, check WTOP for St. Agnes CCD class closing.

Policies and Procedures:

- 1. Students are reminded that all property and possessions found in the classroom are to be left untouched. Desks are not to be moved from their allocated position.
- 2. No food or drink, including chewing gum is allowed in the classrooms because of food allergies.
- 3. Items that could cause injury to a student or others (including dangerous toys) are not permitted in the building.
- 4. Every student has the right and privilege to learn in a classroom where students are well behaved. Similarly, every catechist has the right to teach

in such an environment. In the event a student does not exhibit proper behavior, the catechist will call upon the Director of Faith Formation to remove the child from the classroom. If the child does not attempt to refrain from the improper behavior, the DFF will enlist the support of the parents to rectify the situation.

5. If a child must leave class early, a parent is required to inform the DFF, Lisa Orosa, at drop off so that the child can be brought from the classroom to the front office/door for pickup.

Dress Code:

Students should dress comfortably according to the weather, but modesty in dress should always be maintained. Articles of clothing with inappropriate images or sayings (drugs, alcohol, profanity, weapons) are not permitted.

Short shorts, bare midriffs, (girls) or low hanging pants (boys) are not permitted. Hats must be removed before entering the building.

Electronic devices:

Students who bring cell phones to class must keep these devices turned off and out of sight. At no time during class are students permitted to use these devices.

Learning Disabilities/Health related problems:

If your child has a learning disability or health related problem, please indicate this on the registration form. All information will remain confidential but will be passed on to the catechist for their assistance in teaching your child.

Safe Environment Training:

All program employees, staff and volunteers who have direct contact with children are subject to a Police background check, fingerprinting and the completion of a VIRTUS seminar.

St. Agnes Religious Education program participates in and adheres to the Safe Environment Training Program – Circle of Grace. This is a program with age appropriate lessons on the topic of personal safety. Catechists in the program are responsible for administering these lessons, the curriculum for which is provided by the Arlington Diocese. These lessons are presented in the fall of the school year. Parents will be provided with an Opt-Out form by the Director of Faith Formation if they do not wish their child to participate in this program.

6th grade The Divine Mercy
7th grade The Angelus and Memorare
8th grade The Come Holy Spirit prayer
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Textbooks/Online program:

1st through 7th grade use the *Faith and Life Series* published by Ignatius Press. They will receive the online book through My Catholic Faith Delivered. Children will not receive a textbook; parents will receive instructions to log in once registration has been completed.

8th grade will use Chosen: your Journey towards Confirmation by Ignatius Press.

St. Agnes has moved to a 9th grade Fall Confirmation. We will <u>not</u> have the sacrament of Confirmation in October 2021 but will have Confirmation in the Fall of 2022. Therefore, this year 2021/22 the Chosen program book will be taught to the 8th grade.

Sacrament Preparation:

Sacrament Preparation for children is a two-year process. Therefore, First and Second grades are required for a child to receive First Penance and First Holy Communion.

Seventh and Eight grades are required for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

Special: If a child has missed multiple years following First Holy Communion, they will need to renew their CCD instruction by attending 6th grade.

The following is a brief outline of the essential elements of each grade level curriculum:

Grade One

Goal: To give the child a basic introduction to God, the life of Christ, prayer.

Themes:

- = Introduction to the Trinity (emphasis upon Jesus)
- = The plan of salvation and how the child fits into that plan knowing, loving and trusting God
- = Mary, angels, saints
- = Basic prayers

Grade Two

<u>Goal:</u> To prepare second grade students for Confession and Holy Communion and to help them appreciate God's love for them as manifested in these two sacraments.

Themes:

- = Preparation for reception of the Sacraments of Penance and Holy Communion
- = Divine law and salvation history

- = God's mercy and love
- = Ten Commandments, Creation and Redemption
- = Order of the Mass and prayer

Grade Three

<u>Goal:</u> To show the student's membership among God's chosen people and role of the family as an important segment of God's entire family – the Church

Themes:

- = God's plan of salvation from Creation to the Incarnation and Redemption to the birth of the Church at Pentecost and our life in the Church
- = Importance of Confession, Holy Communion and Mass
- = Importance of prayer and love of God's law

Grade Four

<u>Goal:</u> To help the students understand their purpose in life and to come to an awareness of God's plan in history and society in order to lead all to Heaven, our true, eternal home.

Themes:

- = God's plan of salvation from sin (salvation history)
- Our participation in God's plan and how God assists us through His word, law, and the Church

Grade Five

<u>Goal:</u> To help fifth graders acquire a solid and specific knowledge of God and His church through knowledge of the Creed and by making theological distinctions in order to avoid errors that lead to a loss of love of God.

Themes:

- = Thorough study of the Creed and the basic tenants of Catholicism
- Emphasis on an understanding of theological definitions through the words of the Gospels, the prophets, and the prayers of the church

Grade Six

<u>Goal:</u> To nurture a love for God's law and a love for the Holy Mass as our most perfect prayer to God. Students will also be formed to develop a sense of deep reverence and love of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament.

Themes:

- = God's law (especially the Ten Commandments) as the blueprint for a life of love
- = Emphasis upon the doctrine of the Real Presence of Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament, especially in the Mass
- = The interaction between God's law and His gifts of grace given to the faithful to fulfill His law

Grade Seven

<u>Goal:</u> To assist the student in learning to treasure the seven sacraments as indispensable to a full Christian life of love and truth. To understand the nature of grace in the soul and its relationship to the life of virtue, reason, and faith.

Themes:

- = Grace as our link with God and His gift to bring us to eternal life with Him
- = Grace through the seven sacraments
- = Grace through revelation (prophets, Incarnation, the Church)
- = Grace and the life of virtue

Grade Eight

<u>Goal:</u> To help the student know and love the Church as Christ's Body and the Magisterium as the definitive voice of Christ on earth manifested in the person of the Pope. The student will also be formed to trust and be strengthened by the Church in order to face the confusion of secularism in modern-day society with greater confidence.

Themes:

- = Church history from its founding by Christ and its birth in the Holy Spirit
- = The four marks of the Church one, holy, catholic, and apostolic
- = Church Fathers, Doctors of the Church, the saints and the role of the religious and laity in the Modern Age
- = The structure of the Church hierarchy, the role of the Magisterium (teaching charism) vocations to the single, married, and religious life

Assessments and Grading

St. Agnes' Religious Education program follows the Standards of Learning set forth by the Diocese of Arlington. These guidelines help us to determine a child's knowledge of the Faith and therefore advance to the next grade. All students will be given a mid-term and final exam, according to their age and grade level. To help students prepare for these exams, weekly attendance at class or online is required and completion of the homework at the end of each online chapter.

At the end of 8th grade, students will be given a comprehensive test that will determine their readiness to receive the sacrament of Confirmation in the fall of their 9th grade.
