Dear St. Agnes Year 1 Confirmation Students,

Welcome to our Confirmation Program at St. Agnes. Confirmation at St. Agnes is a two year preparation where students begin preparation usually in the 7th Grade and are confirmed in the Spring of their 8th Grade.

At Baptism, we are born spiritually. We become sharers in the divine life of the most Blessed Trinity. For most of us, our parents asked for the gift of Baptism on our behalf when we were infants. The Holy Spirit infused our soul with the gifts of wisdom, understanding, knowledge, fortitude, piety, counsel and fear of the Lord. These gifts, along with a life of grace, formation and prayer helped us grow in love and deeper faith with Our Lord, Jesus Christ.

Confirmation is the Sacrament that signals a maturation in grace in the spiritual life of a Christian. As Confirmation candidates near adulthood, they give their free will assent to membership and service to the Church. With the increased outpouring of the gifts of the Holy Spirit, they are empowered to serve the Church and take on the mission of Christ to make disciples of all nations. It is the beginning of a lifetime journey of intentional discipleship.

In Year 1, you will begin your preparation for Confirmation by learning more about the Faith, reflecting on the Sunday Gospels, and discovering that you can contribute meaningfully to the Church and society through the generous sharing of your gifts.

Saint Agnes aims to accompany and encourage our students and families by forming the whole person:

- MIND: Through faithful and thorough catechesis in class, students will learn the timeless teachings of Jesus through the Church. Through stimulating discussions, students learn how to defend their Faith and become true soldiers of Christ.
- HEART: Through prayers, holy hour, devotions, and retreats students will be given opportunities to open their hearts and enter a more intimate relationship with Jesus Christ.
- SOUL: Through frequent reception of the Sacraments of Penance, faithful attendance
 of Sunday Mass and holy days of obligation, and reflection on the Gospel readings,
 students will be nourished spiritually and come to a more mature faith.
- STRENGTH: Through the generous sharing of their gifts with the less fortunate, students will learn how to live out their faith in concrete ways.

Of course, this journey cannot be taken alone. Your parents promised at your Baptism to teach you and be role models in the Faith. St. Agnes is ready to support your parents in their baptismal promises and help you become all that God created you to be.

YEAR 1 REQUIREMENTS

FORMS & INTERVIEW

Registration and copies of the student's birth certificate, baptismal certificates, parent & student agreements are due on September 12, 2025. In addition, interviews with one of the St. Agnes priests will need to be schedued once during the year.



PARENT & STUDENT RETREAT

The student and at least one parent are required to attend a mandatory retreat. The retreat will help participants reflect on God's purpose for their lives as they prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation.

MASS JOURNALS & OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

Students are expected to attend Sunday Mass.
They should know the importance of faithful attendance of Sunday Mass and holy days of obligation. The Eucharist is the source and summit of our Faith because it is Jesus Himself who feeds us with His own flesh and blood.
Without the Eucharist, we become severely malnourished spiritually, intellectually, and emotionally. We cannot grow as His disciple nor fulfill the mission God has planned for us. However, mere physical presence at Mass is not enough for the confirmed Catholic.

The faithful Catholic is one who joyfuly participates at Mass, reflects on the Word of God and generously offers a portion of their blessings as a sign of thanksgiving to God and in support of the Church. Students are expected to thoughtfully complete their weekly Mass journals and drop their offertory/prayer request envelopes at every Sunday Mass at St. Agnes. Mass journals are to be submitted at the end of each month. Mass Journals & offertory envelopes begin on October 5th.

SERVING CHRIST IN THE CHURCH

Service to the poor, the needy and the Church is a response to God's love who calls us to generously share our time and talents. In addition, studies have shown that young people are more likely to stay in the Faith when they know and serve with other adults who serve in the parish. Students are expected to serve primarily through the Church in parish-wide days of service and help in parish events/ministries for a total of 10 hours each year.

MASS JOURNALS

"All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for refutation, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that one who belongs to God may be competent, equipped for every good work."

As students prepare to be confirmed in the Catholic Faith, it is important that they not only attend Mass regularly and on holy days of obligation, but also immerse themselves in the Word of God, reflecting on its message and living it out in their daily lives. St. Jerome, who translated the Bible into Latin in the first century, famously said, "Ignorance of Scriptures is ignorance of Christ."

Each Sunday and holy days of obligation, students will be asked to thoughtfully reflect on the Gospel Reading through Mass Journal sheets. These Mass journal sheets are due on the October 28th, December 2nd, January 5th, February 3rd, March 3rd, April 14th and May 5th.

OFFERTORY ENVELOPES

"Tell the rich in the present age not to be proud and not to rely on so uncertain a thing as wealth but rather on God, who richly provides us with all things for our enjoyment. Tell them to do good, to be rich in good works, to be generous, ready to share, thus accumulating as treasure a good foundation for the future, so as to win the life that is true life."

(1Timothy 6:17-19)

Students are asked to practice stewardship, generously and joyfully offering a portion of God's blessing in support of the Church. Students will be given offertory/intercessory envelopes that are labeled with their names. Students are asked to prayerfully reflect on the many blessings God has given them and to offer a small portion of their blessings each week in their offertory envelope. In addition, the student may also indicate if they have offered their time or talent, in addition to or in lieu of their monetary offering. This will be collected by the ushers during offertory at Sunday Mass in St. Agnes. (NOTE: These envelopes are only for use in St. Agnes.)

In the event that the student forgets to bring the envelope, the envelopes found in the pews or at the Narthex may be used.

If students attend Sunday Mass at another Church, they may submit their envelopes to the Parish Office.

Mass Journals and Offertory Envelopes begin on October 5, 2025.

SERVICE AS A RESPONSE TO GOD'S LOVE

"Faith of itself, if it does not have works, is dead. Indeed someone may say, "You have faith and I have works." Demonstrate your faith to me without works, and I will demonstrate my faith to you from my works."

(James 2:17-18)

Acts of service is a response to God's love and an opportunity to reflect God's love to others. It is an integral expression of one's faith in a compassionate and Providential God and a demonstration of one's desire to follow Jesus who says, "Love one another as I have loved you." (John 13:34)

Everyone has the capacity and the talent to joyfully contribute for the good of the parish and the community. Even young children discover the joy of giving and making a difference in someone's life when given the opportunity and in following the example of parents. For a service activity to count, it must be open to both St. Agnes school students and Religious Education students and the activity/event is sponsored by St. Agnes Church. If you would like to serve the poor or the parish in an activity not listed above, please contact Mrs. Orosa for approval at dff@saintagnes.org. In addition, service activities outside of St. Agnes Parish may be accepted (with pre-approval) for half-credit. Please fill out the Service Log in the next page and submit by the due date.

PARENT PREPARATION AGREEMENT

As a parent of a child preparing to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, I will make every effort to participate fully in my child's preparation for this Sacrament, specifically:

- I will ensure that my child is adequately prepared to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation through which they are made strong and more firmly obligated by word and deed to witness to Christ and to spread and defend the faith (Canon Law 879).
- As a parent I am the first herald of the Faith to my child (CCC 1656). I will ensure the faith formation of my child and will ensure that my child completes their homework and other requirements assigned by their catechist (RE) or their Religion teacher (SAS). This includes:
 - o Completion of weekly lessons & assessments with a passing grade of 70% or more.
 - Completion of lessons, homework and tests for SAS students as required by their Religion teacher.
 - o Completion of midterm and final exams with a passing grade of 70% or more
 - Completion of weekly Mass Journal reflections and timely submission of Offertory Envelopes
 - Participation in Family Day of Service events at St. Agnes Church and other parishsponsored activities.
 - Submission of required forms in a timely manner.
- The Eucharistic sacrifice, the memorial of the death and resurrection of the Lord, in which the sacrifice of the cross is perpetuated through the ages, is the summit and source of all worship and Christian life (Canon Law 897). I will ensure that my child participates each Sunday and every Holy Day of Obligation in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass.
- I will attend the Confirmation Year 1 (7th Grade) retreat and ensure that my student attends and fully participates in this retreat as well.
- I will schedule and attend an interview for myself and my child with a St. Agnes priest to determine other ways to grow in our family's practice of the faith.
- I will attend to my own personal faith formation and live out the sacramental life fully, as a role model to my children.

I understand that Confirmation is NOT graduation from religious education but an important milestone in my child's journey toward intentional discipleship. Therefore, I will continue to support and encourage my child in the practice of the Faith throughout the year and in the succeeding years after Confirmation.

I understand that failure to complete the above requirements may delay my child's reception (
the sacrament of Confirmation from the Spring 2027 to Spring 2028 .

STUDENT PREPARATION AGREEMENT

As I prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, I will make every effort to adequately prepare for the reception of the Sacrament, specifically:

- The Lord commands us to "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy" (Exodus 20:8) and as I prepare to receive the Sacrament of Confirmation, I will attend the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass in person each Sunday and every Holy Day of Obligation.
- As it is written in Sacred Scripture, "Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you" (1 Peter 3:15). Therefore, in order to continue to grow in my knowledge of the faith, I will attend and fully participate in my Religious Education classes or Religion classes at St. Agnes School. I will endeavor to complete my assignments and achieve an overall passing grade of 70% in my chapter/unit assessments and midterm and final exams.
- Christ came "not to be served, but to serve" (Mathew 28:20). Looking towards the example of Christ, I will selflessly and lovingly serve others as I prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation through participation in the St. Agnes Family Days of Service and other parish-sponsored volunteer activities, as indicated in this handbook. I understand that any activities not listed here must be pre-approved by the Director of Faith Formation.
- Christ spent 40 days in the desert before He began his public ministry. Through the Sacrament of Confirmation, I am more "strictly obligated to spread and defend the faith by word and deed." (CCC 1285). Therefore, I will attend and actively participate in the Year 1 Confirmation retreat to prepare to receive the sacrament and to grow as a true witness of Christ.
- St. Jerome said "Ignorance of Scripture is ignorance of Christ." Therefore, I will nurture my relationship with Jesus Christ by reflecting on the Word of God in the Sunday Liturgical Readings and submit the Mass Journal Reflections each week as required.
- "Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." (1Peter 4:10) As a sign of my gratitude for my many blessings, I will contribute to the needs of the poor and the Church by sharing my time, talent or treasure through my weekly offertory envelope.
- The fourth commandment, "Honor thy father and mother", is addressed to children in their relationship to their father and mother, because this relationship is the most universal. However, it requires honor and gratitude be extended to the duties of pupils to teachers. (CCC 2199). I understand that the teachers, catechists and aides in the classroom represent my parents and deserve my attention and respect. I further understand that if my behavior is disruptive and does not improve after several warnings, I may be dismissed from the Confirmation class.
- I will schedule and participate in an interview with one of our St. Agnes priests.
- I understand that failure to complete the above requirements may delay my reception of the sacrament of Confirmation for this school year. I understand that I may receive Confirmation in the following year, once I am fully prepared to receive the sacrament.
